Welcome New BDOCA Member Herman Jordaan

We have a new member: Herman Jordaan, D.Mus., FRCO, recently appointed DoM at St John's, Sidcup. A very warm welcome to him.

Herman grew up in Pretoria, South Africa. He studied organ with Wim Viljoen at the University of Pretoria. He continued his studies at the Conservatory of Amsterdam with Jacques van Oortmerssen and also studied at the Royal Conservatoire in The Hague with Jos van der Kooy. He obtained the degree Doctor of Music (Performing Art) at the University of Pretoria in 2021, with his studies focusing on South African organ music. He was winner of the first prize at the Interpretation Competition at the prestigious St Albans International Organ Festival in the United Kingdom in 2003. He was also awarded first prizes at the Schnitger International Organ Competition, the International Organ Competition Nijmegen, and the Unisa National Organ Competition, and second prize at the Kotka International Organ Competition. He is a prize-winning Fellow of the Royal College of Organists. International concert tours have taken him around the world – South Africa, Europe, the United States, and as far as Russia.

We look forward to getting to know him.
